

Changes to our Tenant Services Team

Our interim Housing Manager, Robert Boswell, left us in October and the Association made the decision not to recruit a Housing Manager but to utilise the skills it already has within our Head Office Team.

The walk route took in some of Eldon's sheltered housing schemes and 2 of Croydon Council's Nursing Homes/Day Centres where we have staff working.

First stop on the route after an uphill walk of about an hour was Langley Oaks where we were welcomed with a cup of tea by Cook Sandra Purle, after a short rest we moved on to Garden Court arriving there to a warm round of applause from the tenants gathered in the lounge for coffee.

The tenants at Garden Court had provided tea, coffee, cakes and fruit for us and also organised their own raffle which raised £100.00. Suitably refreshed we moved on to Lindsay Court and arrived whilst tenants were taking coffee, it was great to catch them for a chat before they started their lunch. Cold drinks were provided plus delicious home made rock cakes - we all saw the cakes as guilt free on the day due to our walking the calories off between schemes !!

Sharon Furbank daughter of Garden Court tenant, Doreen Lockyer, wanted to remember her Great Uncle - Francis Robert Shrimpton

Francis was born in Long Crendon in Buckinghamshire, a Baker by trade, the youngest of 4 children, and was 23 years old at the start of the Great War.

Unfortunately his family have been unable to obtain his military records as these were some of the many thousands destroyed during bombing in London in 1940.

What they do know is that Francis was a Gunner in the Royal Garrison Artillery, the 342nd Siege Battery which was formed in January 1917 in Weymouth and was equipped with 6inch 26cwt Howitzers. The Battery sailed for France from Southampton on 29th May 1917.


Siege batteries moved frequently between different Heavy Artillery Groups sometimes staying with a group for just a few days making it very difficult to trace his movements.

Sadly Francis was killed in action in France on 29th



November 1917, the cause and exact location of his death are unknown. He is buried in the Steenkerke Belgium Military Cemetery a small cemetery which is around 18 miles north of Ypres. Sharon and her family have visited his grave and have his memorial plaque, commonly known as a Death Penny, which was issued to the families of all British and Empire service personnel killed in action in WW1

Sharon and her family continue to research Francis Shrimpton's history and never want his name to be forgotten





and on 27th September 2014 Uncle Frank's name was read out in the Roll of Honour at the Tower of London which took place daily whilst those amazing ceramic poppies were in place. Sharon took her 12 year old daughter along to hear the Beefeater read out his name and to listen to the playing of The Last Post which ensured that another generation will remember him.

Thank you to Sharon for sharing her Uncle Frank's story.
